



- For our volunteers. Please pray that God would bless them, we are so grateful for the time and love they share with our guests. ©





HARVEST FOR HUNGER

2025 Recap



Canadian Foodgrains Bank is rooted in the belief that humankind is created in the image of God and that it is God's desire that no person should go hungry. We live in a world of abundance. We also live in an unequal world. 11 years ago, Owen Sound Harvest for Hunger was initiated as a project of the Owen Sound Alliance Church, raising funds for Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Canadian Foodgrains was chosen as a great organization to get involved with, to help feed the hungry in the world. Canadian Foodgrains Bank says "In living out our Christian response to hunger, we will be known for sector leading, locally-driven innovative partnerships that by 2026 will support systemic change to increase food security for at least 1.5 million people each year." They work with over 100 international partners to address global hunger.

Specifically, money raised through our project is forwarded to Canadian Alliance Justice & Compassion. They are supporting ongoing projects in Yemen and Niger. Yemen has been experiencing war and civil conflict since 2014. They continue to experience alarming levels of hunger as a result of long-term conflict, climate shocks, epidemic outbreaks, the collapse of essential services and economic crisis that have resulted in an estimated 18.2 million people needing humanitarian aid. Our project is supporting food distribution and hopes to add agriculture support programs to help them become sustainable and food secure.

One beneficiary expressed her gratitude saying "I had never thought that our life would change like this; we ended up with no shelter and no income; we had to beg to afford the money for our daily meals. My children dropped out of their schools to sell tissues to people here. God has sent you to save our lives in this miserable situation."

Since 2008, The Alliance Canada has been partnering with Samaritan's Purse Canada to use our Canadian Foodgrains funds for agriculture and animal husbandry projects in Niger. Plagued with an inhospitable climate, chronic poverty and insecurity, this has always been a challenging place to work. Our projects target some of the poorest regions and villages and offer education and support to help increase and diversify crop production, as well as improve knowledge and access to financial services, savings groups and income generating activities. They have seen very obvious signs of success in many of their projects over the years and have seen over a hundred women's savings groups form.

The Alliance Canada, through the Foodgrains bank funding, are looking at launching a project in Iraq with partners there. This project would focus on refugees in two areas of Iraq. Both of these areas have significant possibility for tangible humanitarian help and also spiritual impact, and they hope to launch by the end of this year.

You have now heard how very great the need is, but how does this relate to us? In Pastor Greg's message last week, he said "A precursor to partnering with God in His work is obtaining knowledge that leads to a moved heart." Collectively, we have been moved to support and raise funds for this work, and I hope that you will continue to do so.



Although our project has been very low key this year, without a large event at the farm, we are still active. The Torrie family, as well as ourselves, are still growing crops for Harvest for Hunger. That harvest is now complete, with somewhat lower yields than average, due to lack of timely rain. Those proceeds will go towards the project, and we hope that you might continue to support our efforts in helping those less fortunate. Over 720 million people do not get enough to eat each day. This represents 1 out of 11 people in the world. We are thankful for the small part we can play in feeding them and spreading God's word. To support this project you can donate online through the church, just add Foodgrains to the memo.





Join us for a Worship Night on Sunday, November 30th at 7pm-8pm. We'll be doing worship nights the last Sunday of every month at 7pm.




Listening Prayer
